

Participants must be 15 years of age on or before the final scheduled session of the course. Rarticipants interested in taking the June in-person class being run through FdL High School Summer School must contact the Rec. Dept. at (920) 929-2885 to register. A fee may apply for those who reside outside of the FdL School District.

#### Lifeguard Training Pre-requisite Skills Test (to be completed prior to beginning of class):

#### Skill Test 1:

- Jump into the water and totally submerge, resurface then swim 150 yards using crawl, breast stroke or a combination of both. (Swimming on the back or side is permitted. Swim goggles are allowed)
- · Maintain position at the surface of the water for 2 minutes by treading water using only the legs
- Swim 50 yards using the front crawl, breaststroke or a combination of both

#### Skill Test 2: Complete within 1 minute, 40 seconds

- Starting in the water, swim 20 yards. (The face may be in or out of the water. Swim goggles are not allowed)
- Surface dive (feet-first or head-first) to a depth of 7 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object.
- Return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point, holding the object at the surface with both hands and keeping the face out at or near the surface.
- Exit the water without using a ladder or steps.

If you would like to practice prior to being tested, please call the Aquatic Center at (920) 929-3536 and check for available open swim hours and let them know you are coming in to practice prior to testing.

**Prairie Trail:** Urban, paved surface trail. Trailheads located at Winnebago Dr./US 151 and at 485 Reinhardt Ct. A 7-mile multiple-purpose recreation trail along the US 151 FDL Bypass. This connector trail will link the Peebles Trail, future Plank Road Trail & the Wild Goose State Park Trail.

**Downtown Trail:** 1 mile paved trail parallels the FDL River & extends from Brooke St. south to Morris St. through downtown Fond du Lac.

**Brooke Street Trail:** Paved trail extending north to Lakeside Park & south to Dixie St., total of 1.5 miles long. This trail links with the Downtown Trail & will eventually link up with the Wild Goose State Park Trail.

**Greenway Arboretum:** Consists of 14 acres of natural habitat along the East branch of the Fond du Lac River. Access to the Greenway can be found behind the Salvation Army store on Pioneer Rd. The natural trail will lead you into the arboretum and loop back to starting point.

**Lakeside Park Trail:** Over 2.5 miles of paved trail. Trail takes you through much of Lakeside Park with beautiful views of Lake Winnebago.

**StoryWalks:** Discover picture book adventures as you walk through Hamilton and Lakeside Park by visiting the latest Story-Walks. StoryWalks encourage families to enjoy reading and the outdoors by posting a children's book – a page at a time – at intervals along a path. During the warm season, StoryWalks get a new story each month.

#### RESIDENTS/NON-RESIDENTS (R/NR)

Residents: A resident is defined as one whose primary residence resides within the Fond du Lac School District boundaries. Non-Residents: A non-resident is defined as anyone who lives outside of the Fond du Lac School District boundaries. Non-residents are subject to a non-resident fee.

#### GRADE/AGE RANGES

Participants registering for any class must meet the age requirement prior to or on the first day the class begins. The ages are set to ensure the safety and benefit of the participants as well as the program leaders.

#### **CLASS SIZES**
